





Greenblatt, Alan. Free speech at risk: will it survive government repression? CQ Researcher, v. 23, Issue 16, Apr. 2013.

Governments around the globe have been weakening free-speech protections because of concerns about security or offending religious believers. After a phone-hacking scandal erupted in the British press and Muslims worldwide violently protested images in the Western media of the Prophet Muhammad, European nations enacted new restrictions on hate speech, and Britain is considering limiting press freedom. Autocratic regimes increasingly are jailing journalists and political dissidents or simply buying media companies to use them for propaganda and to negate criticism. Muslim countries are adopting and rigidly enforcing blasphemy laws, some of which carry the death penalty.

Everyone knows that the Internet has changed how businesses operate, governments function, and people live. But a new, less visible technological trend is just as transformative: big data. Big data starts with the fact that there is a lot more information floating around these days than ever before, and it is being put to extraordinary new uses. Big data is about more than just communication: the idea is that people can learn from a large body of information things that they could not comprehend when they used only smaller amounts. Big data is meant to inform, rather than explain; it points toward understanding, but it can still lead to misunderstanding, depending on how well it is wielded.

Wall Street is back: a special report on international banking. The Economist, v. 407, Number 8835, May 2013.

For a few tense weeks in 2008, as investment-bank executives huddled behind the imposing doors of the New York Federal Reserve, Wall Street seemed to be collapsing around them. Hank Paulson, the treasury secretary at the time, recalled in his memoir that: Lose Stanley and Goldman Sachs would be next in line--if they fell the financial system might vaporise. Across the Atlantic, European politicians saw this as the timely comeuppance of American capitalism. European banks saw the crisis as their chance to get one up on the American banks that had long dominated international finance. Almost five years on it is Europe's banks that are on their knees and Wall Street that is resurgent. One of the reasons that American banks are doing better is that they took the pain, and dealt with it, faster.
